



GREENLOW POLICY

PURPOSE

Greensborough Junior Football Club (GJFC) was established in 1964 and is the oldest junior football club in the Diamond Valley area. GJFC is a growing football club that aims to build Diamond Valley's most inclusive and supportive community sporting club.

This policy outlines the partnership between GJFC and their U17's players and families in relation to the organisation, hosting and conduct of the 'Greenlow' night. GJFC recognises that this function marks the end of an era for these players and should be celebrated.

SCOPE

This policy applies to all attending and involved with the U17 Greenlow.

POLICY

GJFC will supply the following events and items for each U17 team:

1. Room hire for the evening of the Greenlow.
2. Engraved medals for each player.
3. Payment for three GJFC Executives to attend the Greenlow. Additional Executives wishing to attend must pay for themselves.
4. The Senior and Junior Greensborough Football Clubs have made an agreement that the Senior Club will sponsor two U17 players, and in return GJFC will sponsor one U19 player. Rather than exchanging money, the GJFC will provide the sponsorship money to the U17 Team Manager. These funds will cover the attendance of four members of the Senior Greensborough Football Club at the Greenlow.
5. GJFC will pay the venue deposit with the U17 Team Manager to reimburse the GJFC at the time of or soon after the event.
6. GJFC will support any player sponsorship or fundraising opportunities available to support the Greenlow.

Policy Review and Ownership

The contents of this document represent the current policy and procedures of GJFC. This policy is subject to review each year and will be amended appropriately. Amendments will be communicated to members as and when appropriate to ensure that it remains current.
